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ARRESTS 2010: LAW ENFORCEMENT RESPONSE TO CRIME IN THE SAN DIEGO REGION

INTRODUCTION

The Criminal Justice Research Division of the San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG) functions as the Clearinghouse for regional criminal justice information. On an annual basis, the Division prepares a report on local criminal justice agencies' response to crime in the region, as measured by arrest statistics. Such information provides an added dimension to our bi-annual reports on crime data for understanding the nature of crime and an additional measure that can be used in justice system planning.

This CJ Bulletin includes regional arrest rates per 1,000 adult and juvenile population, as well as numbers of arrests by offense type. In addition, 42 supplemental tables, which include statistics for individual jurisdictions, are presented.

Some points to remember when interpreting these numbers include:

- Similar to how the FBI counts reported crimes, the offense or charge attributed to an arrest may reflect only the most serious out of a number of violations included in the case.
- Arrests are documented by the location at which the arrest occurred and cannot be assumed to have any relationship to the location of the crime incident or the residence of the alleged offender.
- Arrest and crime rates and numbers should not be compared to one another. One reason is that the two events may occur in two entirely different periods of time, with an arrest made months or even years after the related crime has been reported.

2010 ARRESTS BY THE NUMBERS

- 268: Average number of adults arrested every day in the San Diego region.
- 94.2: Arrest rate per 1,000 population for youth between the ages of 15 and 17 – the highest arrest rate of any age group.
- 1,436: The average number of adults arrested each month for driving under the influence – one of the most common reason an adult in San Diego County is arrested.
- 10: The average number of youth arrested for a status offense each day in the San Diego region. Over half (58%) of status offense arrests were for curfew violations.

OTHER 2010 ARREST TRENDS AND STATISTICS

- The only arrest category to increase in number for both adults and juveniles from 2009 to 2010 was alcohol- and other drug-related.
- San Diego County tied with San Bernardino for having the highest juvenile arrest rate (50.0 per 1,000 population) among the five largest California counties.
- Despite continued concern about the risk of identity theft, the number of adults arrested for an offense related to forgery, checks, or access cards at the felony and misdemeanor levels declined over the past year, which could be related to greater safeguards in place and more vigilance on the part of consumers.

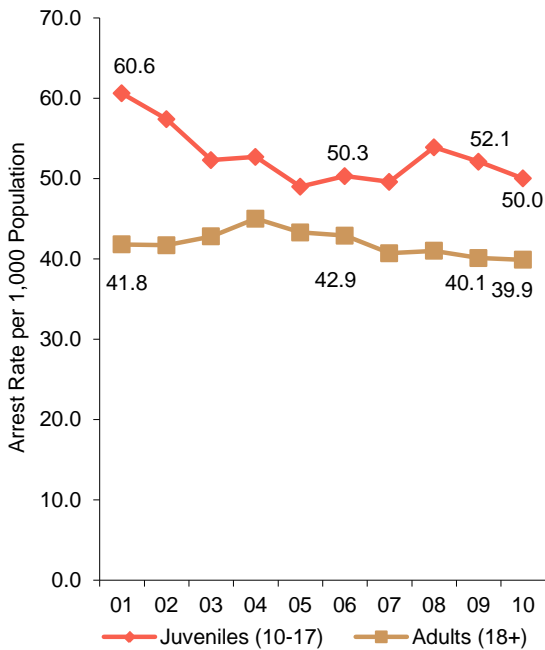
ARREST RATES

Trends

In 2010, there were 39.9 adults arrested per 1,000 population. As Figure 1 shows, this rate represented a slight decrease from 2009 (less than 1%), and a new ten-year low. Across the jurisdictions, the adult arrest rate varied from 18.9 to 77.0 in 2010, with one-year decreases in only 4 of the 19 jurisdictions (Table 7).

The arrest rate for juveniles has traditionally been higher than adults and has decreased to a greater degree, overall, since 2001 (Figure 1). In 2010, the rate of 50.0 represented a four percent decrease from 2009 (when the rate was 52.1). Across the jurisdictions, the juvenile arrest rate varied from 16.6 to 74.6 in 2010, with 13 of the agencies reporting one-year decreases, 4 agencies one-year increases; and for 2 the number of arrests was too small to compare (Table 10).

Felonies and Misdemeanors

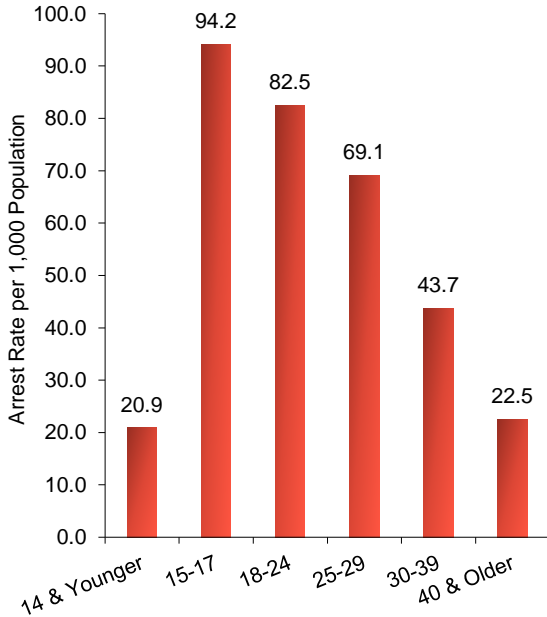
While the adult and juvenile arrest rates both showed an overall decline from 2009 to 2010, the change at the felony/misdemeanor level was different for the two groups. That is, for adults, the felony arrest rate increased by five percent, but the misdemeanor rate decreased by three percent. For juveniles, in comparison, the felony rate decreased (by 9%) and the misdemeanor rate increased (by 3%) (Tables 8, 9, 11, and 12).

Arrestee Age and Race

As Figure 2 shows, the arrest rate by age group peaks for 15 to 17 year olds (94.2 per 1,000), and then declines, from 82.5 for those between the ages of 18 to 24 to 22.5 for those 40 years of age and older. Over the past year, the arrest rate decreased for all of the age groups except those at the higher end of the age range. That is, while the one-year decrease ranged from 1 percent to 5 percent for those under the age of 30, it increased 4 percent for those 30 to 39 and 1 percent for those 40 and over (Table 2).

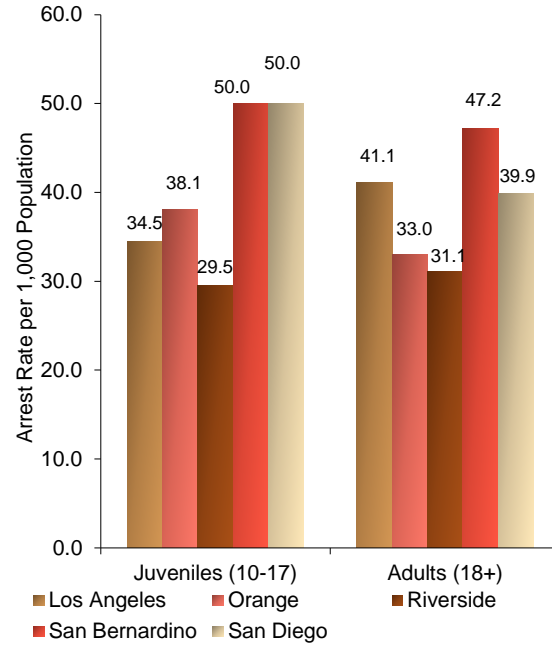
Arrest rates also varied by ethnic group for both adults and juveniles, with individuals of "other" ethnicities having the lowest rate (18.6 and 20.1, respectively), while Blacks had the highest rate (121.6 and 116.8, respectively). Over the past year, the arrest rate decreased for Blacks and Hispanics (3% each), but increased for Whites and those of "other" ethnicities (1% each) (Table 3).

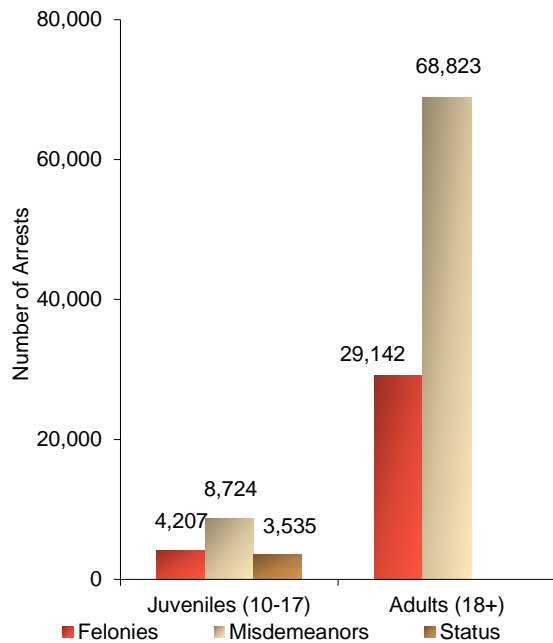
SAN DIEGO COMPARED TO OTHER CALIFORNIA COUNTIES

In 2010, San Diego County had an adult arrest rate (39.9) that was lower than the State's (41.5). However, the region's juvenile arrest rate of 50.0 was higher than the State's (41.5) (Table 6). In addition, as Figure 3 shows, San Diego County tied with San Bernardino for having the highest juvenile arrest rate and had the third highest adult arrest rate, compared to the state's other four most populated counties (San Bernardino, Los Angeles, Orange, and Riverside). Over the past year, all of the five counties had a decrease in their arrest rates overall (ranging from 1% in San Diego and Orange to 14% in Riverside) (Table 6).

NUMBER OF ADULT AND JUVENILE ARRESTS

Even though juveniles have historically had a higher arrest rate per 1,000 population compared to adults, it is important to note that many more adults are actually arrested. In 2010, there were 97,965 adult arrests and 16,466 juvenile arrests, with the majority of these at the misdemeanor level (Figure 4). In other words, on average, there were over 268 adults and around 45 juveniles arrested every day in 2010 in the San Diego region by local law enforcement agencies (not shown).

FOR MISDEMEANOR OFFENSES**



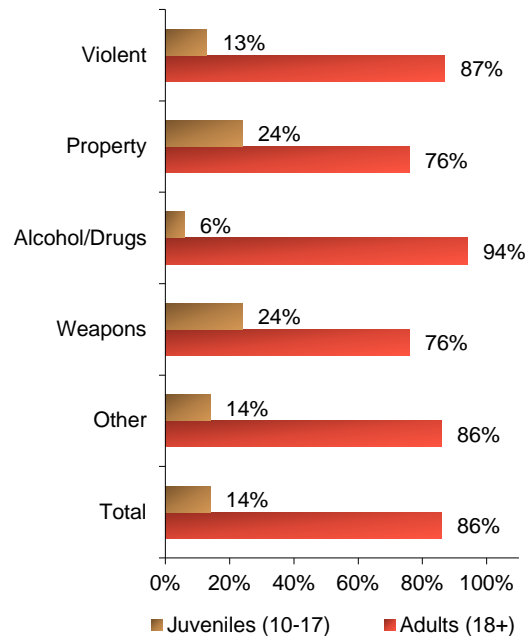

As Figure 5 shows, while 14 percent of all individuals arrested in 2010 were juveniles, there was variation by crime type, with juveniles more likely to be arrested for property and weapons offenses (24% each), and less likely to be arrested for alcohol- and other drug-related offenses (6%).

ARRESTS BY OFFENSE TYPE

What types of crimes are adults and juveniles arrested for? As Figure 6 shows, around half (52%) of adult arrests were for alcohol- or other drug-related violations. In comparison, the distribution across crime type varied more for juveniles, with the most common being status offenses (26%) and other offenses (21%).

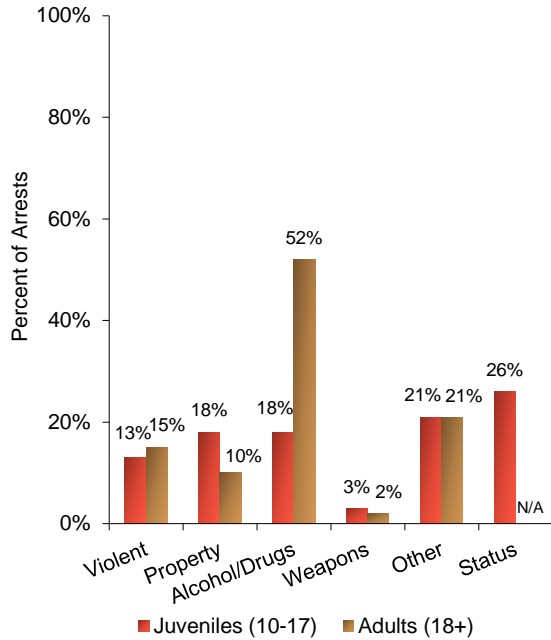
**FIGURE 5

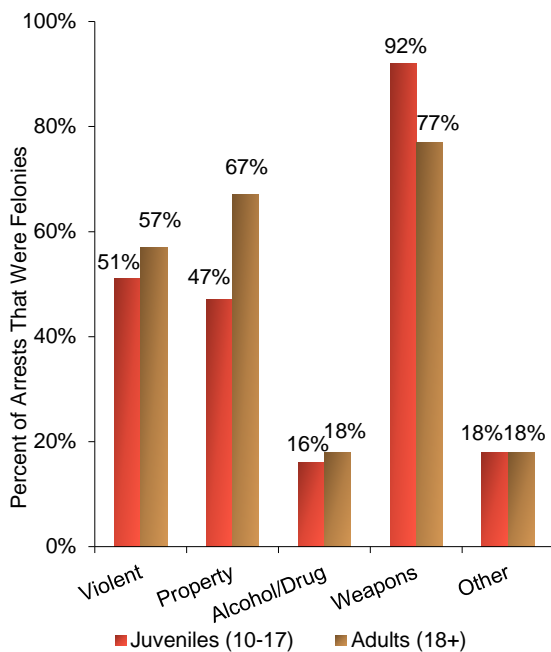
There was also variation across the arrest categories in terms of what percent represented felony- versus misdemeanor-level offenses. As Figure 7 shows, while more than three-fourths of juvenile and adult arrests for weapons offenses were at the felony level (92% and 77%, respectively), a much smaller percent were felonies in the alcohol/drug (16% and 18%) and “other” offense categories (18% each).

LEVEL VARIES BY OFFENSE TYPE**

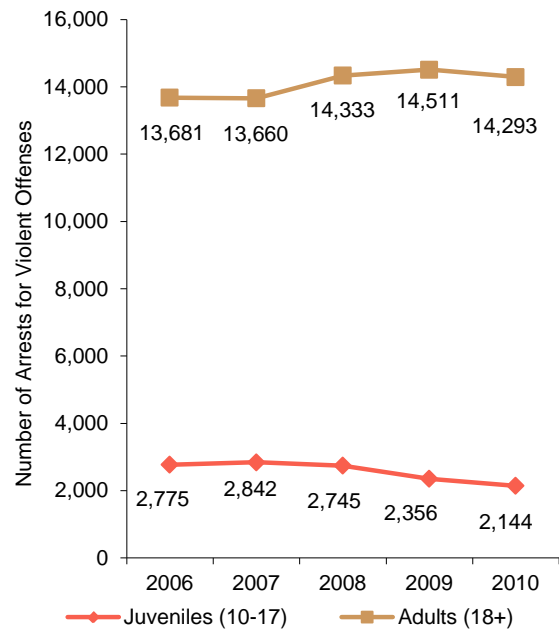

Violent Offenses

The violent offense arrest category includes four felony-level offenses (homicide, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault) and two misdemeanor-level offenses (manslaughter and assault/battery). There were 14,293 adult and 2,144 juvenile arrests for violent offenses in 2010 (Figure 8). Arrests for a violent offense declined for both adults and juveniles over the past year, but to a lesser degree for adults (2%) (Table 21) than juveniles (9%) (Table 34).

DOWN FOR ADULTS AND JUVENILES**



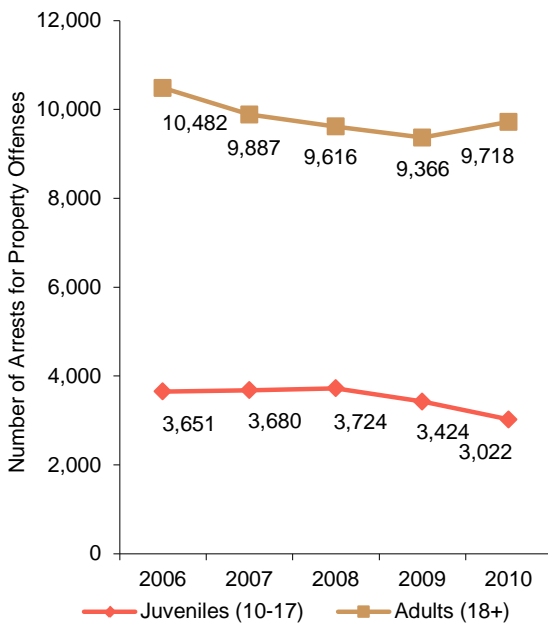

For adults, the greatest one-year decreases in violent crime arrests were for homicide (25%) and robbery (21%), with smaller decreases (ranging from <1% to 3%) for misdemeanor assault and battery and rape (Table 22). For juveniles, there were large declines in the number of arrests made for robbery and aggravated assault (24% and 16%, respectively), but the number of arrests for misdemeanor assault and battery actually increased four percent (Table 35).

Property Offenses

Property offenses include felony-level burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft, and misdemeanor-level petty theft and burglary. In 2010, there were 9,718 adults arrested for a property offense, which represented a four percent increase from 2009, the first following four years of consecutive decreases (Figure 9 and Table 21). For juveniles there was a 12 percent decrease from 3,424 in 2009 to 3,022 in 2010 (Table 34).

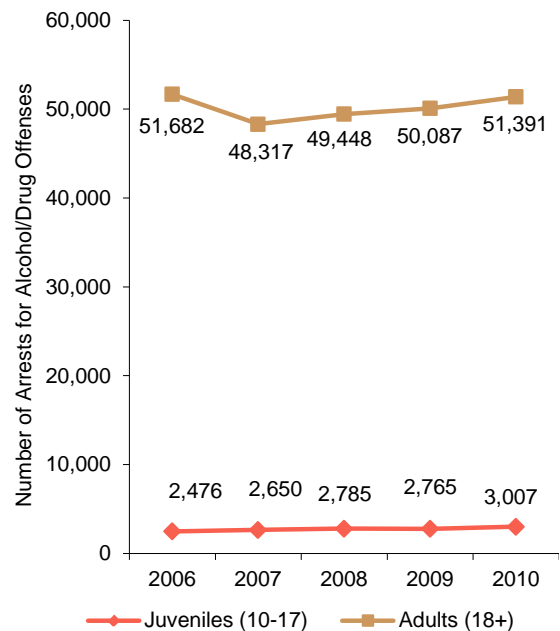
Across the property categories, the only one-year decline for adults was for felony level larceny (2%), with other arrests increasing from 4 percent (burglary) to 13 percent (motor vehicle theft) (Table 23). For juveniles the one-year percent change was double digit for each of the four felony-level property offenses (ranging from 13% for larceny to 22% for burglary). The number of arrests for

misdemeanor petty theft/burglary also went down, but to a lesser degree (3%) (Table 36).

Alcohol- and Other Drug-Related Offenses

In 2010, there were 51,391 adult and 3,007 juvenile arrests for alcohol- and other drug-related offenses (Figure 10). This represented a three percent increase from 2009 for adults (Table 21) and a nine percent increase for juveniles (Table 34).

For adults, there was a one-year increase for each of the five felony-level arrest categories, which ranged from 11 percent (for marijuana) to 27 percent (for dangerous drugs, which includes methamphetamine). In comparison, the number of arrests for misdemeanor-level offenses in this category decrease for four of the five (ranging from 2% to 7%), with the exception of other drug offenses, which include offenses related to the illicit use of

prescription drugs (which increased 11%) (Table 24). For juveniles, the largest one-year increases related to arrests for felony-level dangerous drug (56%) and marijuana (40%) offenses (Tables 37).

Weapons Offenses

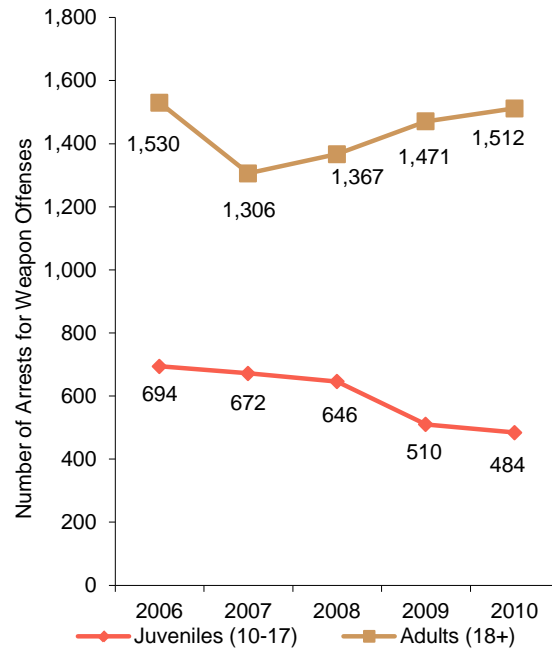
There were 1,512 adult arrests and 484 juvenile arrests for weapons violations in 2010 (Figure 11). For adults, 2010 represented an increase of three percent from the number reported in 2009 (1,471). For juveniles, the decrease from 2009 to 2010 was the fourth consecutive, with a five percent drop from 2009 (Tables 21 and 34).

For adults, arrests for felony-level weapons offenses were down (2%), but misdemeanor offenses were up (21%) (Table 25). For juveniles, both level of offenses decreased over the past year (3% and 23%, respectively) (Table 38).

Other Offenses

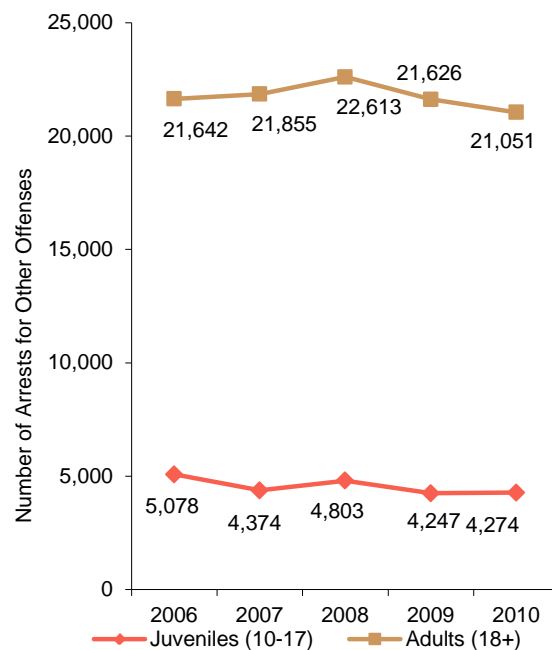
There were 21,051 adult arrests and 4,274 juvenile arrests for “other” offenses in 2010 (Figure 12). At the felony level, “other” charges include sex-related offenses, forgery, and arson, as well as other felonies (such as kidnapping). At the misdemeanor level, offense types include other theft-related charges, sex-related and prostitution, disturbing the peace, vandalism/graffiti, hit-and-run, selected traffic offenses, violations of city/county ordinances, failure to appear in court offenses, and other charges such as contributing to the delinquency of a minor. Over the past year, there was a three percent drop for adults and one percent increase for juveniles (Tables 21 and 34).

NUMBER OF ARRESTS FOR OTHER OFFENSES DOWN FOR ADULTS AND UP FOR JUVENILES**



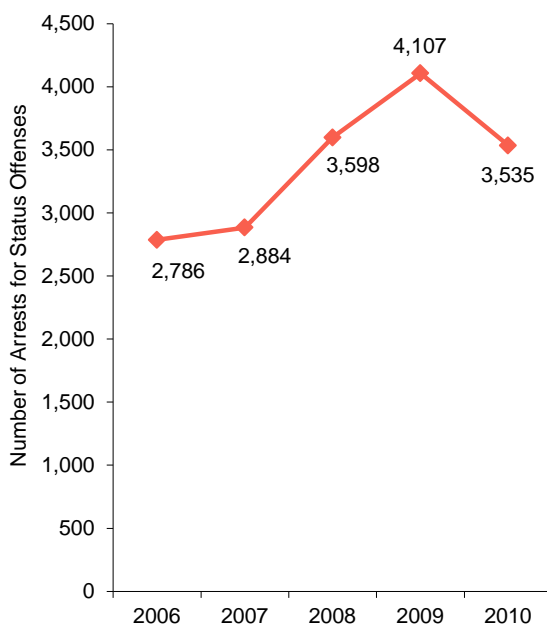

For adults, the most dramatic one-year declines included felony-level forgery/checks/access cards at the felony and misdemeanor levels (down 17% and 22%, respectively) (Table 26). For juveniles, felony-level arrests for sex-related offenses such as lewd conduct decreased 26 percent, but misdemeanor-level prostitution arrests increased 19 percent (Table 39).

Status Offenses

There were 3,535 status offense arrests in 2010, the first decrease in the past five years (Figure 13). Arrests for running away, truancy, and curfew were all down (by 43%, 28%, and 5%, respectively), but arrests for other offenses, including disobeying court orders, were up (by 11%) (Table 40).

SUMMARY

The current CJ Bulletin describes what types of arrests were made in the San Diego region in 2010 by local law enforcement agencies of both adults and juveniles. The arrest rate for adults and juveniles were both down in 2010. While the juvenile arrest rate has traditionally been higher than the adult rate, the difference has declined over time and it is important to note that in terms of numbers, many more adults than juveniles are actually arrested each year (86% of all arrests). About one in every two adult arrests is for an alcohol- or drug-related offense, while juveniles show greater variation in the offense type leading to their justice system contact. Some notable changes over the past year in arrest rates included increases in the number of alcohol- and other drug-related arrests for both adults and juveniles, and declines in the number of arrests for status offenses. More juveniles were arrested for prostitution in 2010 and fewer adults were arrested for crimes associated with forgery or fraudulent use of credit or access cards.
