Feb. 15, 2008: HHSA today urged the public to protect themselves against Syphilis, Chlamydia and Gonorrhea, some of the most common sexually transmitted diseases (STDs).

Feb. 15, 2008: HHSA has confirmed that two more children have tested positive for measles, bringing the total number of confirmed cases to eight.

Feb. 15, 2008: HHSA has confirmed that five more children have tested positive for measles, or have clinical symptoms of the disease and are linked to the original case.

Feb. 14, 2008: HHSA reports that six students at Los Coches Creek Middle School in the Cajon Valley Union School District have been diagnosed with chicken pox.

Feb. 13, 2008: HHSA officials will inform the general public of an increase in syphilis cases and other sexually transmitted diseases (STDs), urge people to protect themselves, and recommend that residents get tested for STDs.

Feb. 13, 2008: The County of San Diego Health and Human Services Agency (HHSA) has confirmed a sixth case of measles related to last week's outbreak. Four additional suspect cases are being investigated.

February 12, 2008; HHSA has confirmed that an 11-month old child is infected with measles.

Feb. 11, 2008: HHSA is waiting confirmation on a fifth case of measles related to last week's outbreak. Five additional suspect cases are being investigated.

Feb. 6, 2008: HHSA has confirmed an additional case of measles at San Diego Cooperative Charter School.

Feb. 4, 2008: HHSA is working closely with the San Diego Wild Animal Park to investigate three confirmed cases of MRSA (methicillin-resistant staphylococcus aureus), a type of staph infection that is resistant to certain antibiotics.

Feb. 4, 2008: HHSA is working with San Diego Cooperative Charter School officials to notify parents and students of a cluster of measles. Two siblings attend the charter school; a third sibling is also infected.

Jan. 14, 2008: HHSA is recommending that the public seek routine medical attention from their primary care providers or at urgent care centers, leaving emergency departments for severely ill individuals.

Jan. 14, 2008: HHSA reports that a San Diego County teenager was sickened by E. coli 0157:H7 after consuming beef that is part of the recently announced national recall of beef products.

Jan. 11, 2008: HHSA is working with Cajon Valley Union School District officials to notify parents and staff who were possibly exposed to meningococcal disease at Flying Hills Elementary School in El Cajon.

Dec. 7, 2007: HHSA reports that eight students at St. Patrick Elementary School in Carlsbad have been diagnosed with chicken pox .

Dec. 4, 2007: HHSA reminds parents to make sure their children have two doses of chicken pox vaccine, after five students at Fuerte Elementary School in El Cajon District are diagnosed with chicken pox.

Oct. 19, 2007: HHSA reports that an individual who worked at the Hi Ball Bar, Chula Vista, had TB between July 1, 2007 and Oct. 10, 2007.

Oct. 15, 2007: HHSA is working with Carlsbad Unified School District officials to notify parents that their children enrolled at Calavera Hills Middle School may have been exposed to chicken pox.

Oct. 10, 2007: HHSA is working with Santee School District officials in their effort to notify parents of students who were possibly exposed to chicken pox (varicella).

Oct. 3, 2007: HHSA is working to notify patrons of several downtown facilities who were possibly exposed to tuberculosis.

Oct. 3, 2007: Six new cases of locally acquired West Nile virus and one non-locally-acquired case have been verified, HHSA announced Oct. 3.

Sept. 21, 2007:HHSA reports five locally acquired cases of West Nile virus.

Sept. 17, 2007: HHSA reminds the public to stay away from bats to prevent possible exposure to rabies.

Sept. 7, 2007: HHSA reports that an individual suspected last week of having locally-acquired West Nile virus has been confirmed to have the disease.

The San Diego County HHSA (Health and Human Services Agency) has been notified of a single case of viral meningitis in Julian. The individual is a student at Julian High School.

Sept. 4, 2007: HHSA reports the first confirmed locally-acquired case of West Nile virus for this year.

Aug. 31, 2007: HHSA urges the public to exercise caution when engaging in outdoor activities during the upcoming holiday weekend, as high temperatures are expected.

Aug. 24, 2007: August is National Immunization Awareness Month, a good opportunity to remind parents to get their children immunized as part of the back-to-school process.
