Bioterrorism (BT) (619) 515-6620 www.emansandiego.com	BT provides planning and response activities for bioterrorism and emergent disease outbreaks with a high public health risk.
Border Health (BH) (619) 692-5639	BH coordinates communication between San Diego and Mexico to address public and environmental health conditions.
Community Epidemiology (CE) (619) 515-6620	CE works to identify, prevent and control communicable diseases.
CE-Community Health Statistics Unit (CHS) (619) 515-4318	CHS provides health statistics that describe health behaviors, diseases and injuries for specific populations, health trends and comparisons to national targets.
CE-Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program (CLPPP) (619) 515-6694	CLPPP seeks to prevent lead poisoning in children through public education and case management for those at risk.
CE-HIV/AIDS Epidemiology Unit (HAEU) (619) 515-6675	HAEU collects, analyzes, and disseminates local HIV and AIDS data to a broad audience.
CE-Office of Vital Records and Statistics (OVRs) (619) 692-5733	OVRs registers all births, deaths and fetal deaths in the county.
CE-Public Health Laboratory (PHL) (619) 692-8500	PHL provides testing for rabies, tuberculosis, sexually transmitted diseases, HIV, other communicable diseases, lead poisoning and bioterrorism investigations.
Emergency Medical Services (EMS) (619) 285-6429	EMS ensures quality emergency medical services, and is involved in community education, as well as prevention and research projects.
Immunization Program (IP) (619) 692-8661	IP helps reduce vaccine-preventable diseases by investigation, education, community collaboration, assessment and the San Diego Regional Immunization Registry.
Maternal, Child and Family Health Services (MCFHS) (619) 692-8808	MCFHS works to promote health and to protect and support pregnant women, children, families and communities.

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MCFHS-Black Infant Health (BIH) (619) 266-7466	BIH helps pregnant and parenting African-American women and their families access health and social services.
MCFHS-Child Health and Disability Prevention Program (CHDP) (619) 692-8808	CHDP provides no cost, well-child health assessments for children who qualify in an effort to prevent or identify health problems.
MCFHS-CHDP-Treatment Reimbursement Program (CHDP-TR) (619) 692-8656	CHDP-TR pays for the treatment and follow-up services of eligible medical conditions identified during a CHDP well-child health examination.
MCFHS-Chronic Disease and Health Disparities (CDHD) (619) 692-5693	CDHD promotes wellness and prevention of illness, disability and premature death from chronic disease and health disparities.
MCFHS-Health Care Program for Children in Foster Care (HCPCFC) (619) 692-8489	HCPCFC works to ensure that children in foster care receive preventive health and dental exams and follow-up of identified health issues.
MCFHS-Perinatal Care Network (PCN) (800) 675-2229	PCN provides health care resources and referrals for pregnant women and women of childbearing age.
MCFHS-San Diego Kids Health Assurance Network (SD-KHAN) (800) 675-2229	SD-KHAN connects children to low-cost or no-cost health insurance, promotes retention of health coverage and provides referrals to community resources.
MCFHS-Share the Care/Dental Health Initiative (619) 692-8858	Share the Care provides dental education and referrals for urgent and preventive dental care for families.
MCFHS-Tobacco Control Resource Program (TCRP) (619) 692-5514	TCRP works to increase awareness of the risks of second-hand smoke; counter pro-tobacco influences; reduce tobacco sales to youth; and encourage tobacco users to quit.
Medical Health Quality Assurance (MHQA) (619) 285-6558	MHQA assesses healthcare delivery systems in the county and recommends improvements to meet current community and best practice standards.
Office of AIDS Coordination (OAC) (619) 296-3400	OAC helps to assure the development and delivery of quality HIV prevention and treatment services.

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OAC-AIDS Case Management Program (ACMP) (619) 296-3400	ACMP provides assistance in accessing medical and support services for individuals living with HIV/AIDS.
OAC-HIV/AIDS Care and Treatment (HIV/AIDS-CT) (619) 296-3400	HIV/AIDS-CT administers federal and state funding to provide health care and support services to residents living with HIV/AIDS.
OAC-HIV Counseling and Testing (HIV-CT) (619) 296-2120	HIV-CT provides HIV risk assessment, counseling, testing, and referral services for persons at risk for HIV infection.
OAC-HIV Prevention (HIV-P) (619) 296-3400	HIV-P services focus on strategies and interventions to prevent the spread of HIV infection.
Public Health Nursing Administration (PHNA) (619) 515-4209	PHNA provides administrative support to PHN's who promote and preserve the community's health status via education, outreach and collaborative activities.
Public Health Services Administration (PHSA) (619) 515-6597	PHSA directs public health programs, safeguards the public's health and responds to public health emergencies.
Reduce or Eliminate Health Disparities with Information (REHDI) (619) 542-4048	REHDI works with community partners to reduce health disparities.
Sexually Transmitted Diseases (STD) and Hepatitis Prevention (STDHP) (619) 692-8082	STDHP controls the spread of STD's through disease surveillance and reporting, treatment and partner services, and viral hepatitis preventive services include screening of at-risk individuals and protective vaccination.
Tuberculosis (TB) Control Program (TBP) (619) 692-5565	TBP detects, controls and prevents the spread of TB through treatment, case management and contact investigation.
TBP-Cure TB/Cure + Binational Referral Program (619) 692-5710	Cure TB/Cure + is a referral program for TB patients and HIV/AIDS patients who travel between the U.S. and Mexico.
TBP-Refugee Health Assessment Program (RHAP) (619) 692-8636	RHAP provides basic health screening and referral services for refugees during their first few months in the County.
